An Introduction to Foundation Stage 2

The scheme of work aims to:

- Provide a 10 minute activity for each week, which may be repeated several times throughout the week;
- Provide activities which are suitable for use in both indoor and outdoor play;
- Provide activities for groups of children with opportunities for self-initiated learning;
- Link activities closely to the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum so that language learning can support children's development and learning across the following areas:
 - Personal, social and emotional development
 - Communication, language and literacy
 - Problem solving, reasoning and numeracy
 - Knowledge and understanding of the world
 - Physical development
 - Creative development
- Provide activities which may be conducted in different languages for those schools and settings preferring to introduce children to a variety of languages. Appendix A provides useful vocabulary and phrases in other languages which can be substituted as appropriate.

Discuss with the children how we meet and greet people. Talk about how children and adults might:

• Wave to someone across the street (to say hello or goodbye)

- Beep a car horn to attract someone's attention and wave
- Shake hands
- Hug
- Kiss

Mention that while we do all of those things we usually smile as we greet, to show that we are pleased to see someone, as opposed to frowning! Act out smiling and frowning and encourage the children to do the same.



Show the children images and DVD clips of people meeting and greeting each other in various countries. The children will see that different places might have different customs according to their culture:

- Shaking hands
- Kissing on either cheek once, twice, three times or four times
- Bowing



Act out different ways of meeting and greeting with finger puppets. The puppets can wave, kiss on either cheek, bow etc. More confident children might like to take the place of one of the puppets, shaking hands with a toy.

Introduce the children to 'Bonjour' or 'Hello' in a language of your choice (see Appendix A), demonstrating new language with finger puppets greeting one another.

Choose a song. (*Alouette* is a lively, traditional song with a catchy tune which you might consider). The children walk or march around the room while the music is playing. When the music is paused, encourage the children to turn to one another, shake hands and say: '*Bonjour*!'

Play the song again. The children sit in a circle or circles. Pass a puppet or toy around the circle. When the music stops, the puppet or toy must say *'Bonjour'* to everyone.

If desired, the children can learn Italian greetings and the song '*Fra Martino*' is available to listen to (See Appendix G for transcript).
